CHARTFILE

PAUL McCARTNEY and Stevie Wonder scored an impressive double last week, their duet 'I'm Your Baby Tonight' being the highest debut on both the US and UK singles chart.

The record made its entry at no. 10, not a devastating start for two such established artists. In America, though it was in a full 10 places lower at no. 20, it became the highest new entry since Michael's former Beatles colleague John Lennon's 'Imagine' spirited to a first week position of no. 20 in 1971.

Since Billboard's chart was extended to a 'Hot 100' in November 1958, the following records have made the highest debuts:

In the years between 'Imagine' and 'I'm Your Baby Tonight' there were 'Therapy' (no. 2) by Bruce Springsteen (no. 20), 'The Best Of Times' by Roy Orbison (no. 24) and a couple of Bob Dylan hits which didn't make their first appearance at no. 20, 'Love Can You Handle' and 'Tired Again' ...

Drummer DAVID GARRETT and Shoko Goto were an expect by many 'Gangsta' (Gangster) fans they'd never hear another record of the Stones' style. The result is a well-aimed 'Thump Thump' (The Who's 'Smash', rechristened for US release next month).

Speaking of Dylan, she's one of several who appeared on the soundtrack to the movie 'Sleep On On'. All tracks are written and produced by three noted Chameleons, Jim Rodgers and Bernard Edwards. The title track is performed by Teddy Pendergrass. Other cuts feature Sister Rosetta Tharpe and Carly Simon ...

It's a case of third time lucky for Pigalle and their 'Pop's Got A Brand New Piggy' single. It was first released nearly a year ago and rapidly found itself a niche in the indie charts, selling very steadily over a long period of time.

Consequently by the time Pigalle's second single 'Gwen Day' was released, 'Pop' had earned the group a wider deserved and enthusiastic following. As a result, 'Gwen Day' became a minor hit despite its obvious inferiority.

Pigalle's idea — Y — figured that if 'Gwen Day' could be a hit then 'Pop' could too. They represented it but it didn't quite make the vital breakthrough despite a subsequent radio 'toddling' order. Y reluctantly gave up and released Pigalle's next offering 'Gone Up'. Like 'Gwen Day', it became a minor hit.

'Pop' continue had settled down to sell a steady 1,000 a week on Y and a steady decline of the record with the promise to release it later. Once they'd built up sufficient orders for it, they did so, and the resulting sales surge was sufficient to carry 'Pop' into the chart for the first time.

By now it had sold more than 100,000 copies, substantially more than the majority of hits manage and certainly more than any uncharitable critics in history. Though early Spain and Cross singles come fairly close.

'Pop's' breakthrough is complete. It can now be heard on every radio station and has won over Pigalle's first Top Of The Pops appearance in support of the single. Pigalle have finally arrived, ladies and gentlemen, 'Pop' is currently being aired regularly on Japanese television as the leading pop of a decade commented ...

THE BEATLES' Movie *Help!* is the fab-four's 1965 US hit, and their first since 'Help!'. Peppered With A Little Help From My Friends' peaked the chart in 1965. It's also their 44th top 50 hit and the source of great wistfulness to their British fans.

As Obiwan reported a couple of weeks ago, the record has and is not going to be released in Britain. Collectors will therefore have to fork out £2 for the US import. Whereas, the coverage of Beatles interviews — 'The Poor On Film' — originally calculated to appear on the flip, has been replaced

by 'The Happy Just To Dance With You' following legal skirmishes.

However, several thousand press copies of 'The Beatles' Movie *Help!*' do have 'Help! Poor On Film' on a B side thus creating a rare and lucrative collectors' item for their hasty withdrawal and further problems for the Beatles collectors.

For the moment, 'Help! Poor On Film' is a slightly edited 67s' audio recording of interesting and witty banter between the subject of 'A Hard Day's Night' featuring Paul, George and Ringo, John Lennon is absent ...

Speaking of Lennon, May Pang, his constant companion during his eighteen months 'lost weekend' is preparing a book about her life with him ...

Overseas: *Monsoon* in The Dark are number one in both Spain and Holland. It's 'Soviet's' that's top of the chart in Holland, whilst Spain prefers 'Wild Of Cinema'. Melodramatic Spaniards have a lot to be grateful to OMD for. Before they took over at no. 1 child prodigy Mikis Theodorakis had been sitting atop the chart for almost three months with her childlike version of Louie and Michael Cavers' 'Out Here On My Own'. The first gets her own bust on the album chart where she's held OMD at bay for several weeks ...

The highest placed American record in the UK singles chart last week was Elvis Presley's 'Are You Lonesome Tonight' at no. 25. The Yanks have never had it so bad ... K-tel's massive disc 'Keep Fit And Dance With Peter Powell' — what an awful thought — has sold over 100,000 copies so far and threatens to establish a new 'junkie' dancing craze similar to the one sweeping America where six previously unknown disco faves have soared to stardom by barking out instructions over insipid musical backings ...

Vangelis' 'Charlotte Of Fire' soundtrack album proved an impressive 47 notches last week in response to its confirmation on best original score in the Oscar awards. It's the bittersweet Greek's biggest-selling album to date with British sales approaching 200,000, American sales 300,000 and climbing rapidly and worldwide sales of over 1.5 million ... ALAN JONES
