





 Madonna defied all her critics in 1985, by selling more than twice as many singles as any other act. She became the first woman to sell three million singles in a calendar year, joining an elite group previously comprising (in order of attainment), The Beatles, Olivia Newton-John and John Travolta, Boney M, Frankie Goes To Hollywood and Wham!. She also became the first woman ever to top the singles artists rankings in any year.

In all, she had eight top 10 singles in 1985, beating the previous record of seven established by Frankie Laine in 1954, and equalled the following year by

Ruby Murray.

Runner-up in the artist rankings was Jennifer Rush, whose lofty position was almost entirely due to whelming success of The Power Of Love'. It was i___only million selling single of 1985, and the first ever by a woman. It was also the first single by a woman to become the number one single of any year - not bad for an artist who was completely unknown in this country a year ago.

Some things, though, never change. The Anglo-

American duopoly remained intact with British acts filling 65 of the top positions, and Americans 28. despite occasional hits from continental, Australian and Canadian acts. The top three American acts were white, but most of the others were black — with the notable exception of the integrated USA For

Africa supergroup.

Top international act was Norway's A-Ha, closely followed by the German Harold Faltermeyer. Faltermeyer was the number one instrumental act, largely due to his gold single 'Axel F', which peaked at number two — as high as any instrumental has climbed since 1973, when the Simon Park Orchestra's 'Eye Level' reached number one.

Of 1984's top 10 acts, only Wham! claimed a similar perch in 1985; this despite a 12 month gap between releases. 1984's runaway champions Frankie Goes To Hollywood were even less productive, their only single of the year being a remixed version of the title to from their album Welcome To The Pleasure Dome'. Accordingly, they dropped to 40th place in the rankings. Currently ensconced in Holland, where they are recording new songs, it will be interesting to how they fare in 1986

of the year, Dire Strai stormed past their rivals in December, to emerge the year's top albums artists. Their triumph was largely due to the overwhelm

popularity of 'Brothers In Arms', which yielded a t of hit singles and sold over a million copies to be the year's best selling album. Two other albums sc million in the survey period — Phil Collins' 'No Ja Required' and Madonna's 'Like A Virgin'.

Bruce Springsteen had his best year ever, and finished as runner-up behind Dire Straits. At one s all seven of Bruce's albums were in the charts at t same time; the greatest domination of the chart si 1977, when the death of Elvis Presley precipi a massive influx of his albums.

In 1985, Presley remained big business, selling nearly 300,000 albums. He had 58 albums amon the year's 7,000 best sellers, as compiled by Galli and analysed by yours truly, 15 more than the semost prolific act, James Last. Others with multip entries in the rankings included Frank Sinatra

David Bowie (30), Beatles and Dylan (both 28), Rolling Stones (27), Hawkwind (25), Status Quo (25), Eric Clapton (25), Elton J (22), Jimi Hendrix (22), Neil Diamond (21) the Who (20). No less than 1,172 albums bore the credit 'Various Artists'.

As in the singles chart, Madonna led the female contingent. In 1983, only five of the top 100 albu artists were women. In 1984, the figure increased 10, and last year it edged up still further to 11. Ec indications are that 1986 will see women advanc still further. 25 years after her death, Billie Holi sold over 75,000 albums to finish in 13th place. I standing has improved considerably in recent yea thanks to a steady stream of re-issues. Some 15 o albums featured in the top 7,000.

1984's top artist, Lionel Richie sunk to 48th place; not surprising since he failed to deliver any new in 1985. Similarly, Michael Jackson, who was runaway winner in 1983, and second last ye dropped to 101st place in 1985, the only artist in year's top 20 to go absent from this year's top 10

Altogether, 59 of 1984's top 100 artists reappeared in the top 100 in 1985, a much higher figure than in the singles chart, where only 29 act featured in the top 100 in both years.

Indigenous acts took 67% of the chart action Americans 25% and the rest of the world just 8%





CHARTFILE

Last year, I introduced the **Transatlantic Hit** actor (THF) as a way of establishing the most opular acts in Britain and America. It is a simple and fective way of measuring the relative popularity of cts on both sides of the Atlantic with maximum ccuracy.

The THF is the result of cross-referencing the top tists' rankings for the UK, as established by yours uly with a little assistance from an IBM 4331, with milar American rankings supplied by 'Billboard'. In ampiling this intercontinental roll of honour I thlessly discard any act which fails to make the top 00 of both the British and American singles or bouns rankings for the year in question. Thus for 985, absentees from the THF include acts like King and Jennifer Rush (popular only in Britain), ourney and REO Speedwagon, their American quivalents.

Having separated the wheat from the chaff, we're ft with the 21 biggest acts of 1985; the outstanding thists whose talents have been recognised on both des c... Atlantic. To determine their THF, we simply dd together their UK/US singles/albums rankings for 985. Here's how they fared — and bear in mind the wer the hit factor, the more successful the act.

So, a comfortable win for **Madonna**, who takes over from 1984 champ **Lionel Richie**. Richie took almost the whole of 1985 off, and so can be excused his lowly placing in this year's list.

In 1984, the 20 acts who qualified for a THF rating were equally split between British and American acts. This year it's Limeys 12, Yankees 8, with one Canadian.

Phil Collins would have been second in the UK singles list if he'd had sole credit for his duets with Marilyn Martin and Philip Bailey. He'd also have been number two UK album artist if we'd added in his Genesis album successes. He would then have

run Madonna a close second overall, instead of finishing fifth.

In conclusion, it's worth noting that US rankings a based on a naive inverse points system, with bonus points for top ten singles, whilst my British rankings which will be published in depth in a later issue of **r** — are, simply, the most accurate and dependable reflection of relative popularity available, taking account of every record to sell more than 500 copi in Britain last year — a total achieved by nearly 50 singles and over 7000 albums.

A fortnight ago 'Now The Christmas Albur was number one. Last week it dropped to number three, and this week it slumps to number 25.

That's the steepest naturally occurring decline eve suffered by a former number one album. I say "naturally occurring" since some very peculiar circumstances curtailed the chart career of one albummediately after it had spent its seventh consecutiv week at number one!

On June 23rd, 1973, the album made its chart debut. It reached number one the following week, a stayed there until August 11th, when the bona fide record companies, jealous of the success of TV merchandisers like K-Tel, Ronco and Arcade, forced the British Phonograph Industry to exclude said companies' albums from the chart.

The chief victim of this spiteful act was the origine soundtrack album 'That'll Be The Day', which halready sold over half a million double albums for Ronco, in its 49-days domination of the chart. The merchandisers' protestations came to nothing and it
