THIS WEEK'S CHART

● The **Pet Shop Boys** hang on for a third week at number one in this week's singles chart, but they're fading fast and seem certain to be overtaken next week, possibly by **Climie Fisher**, probably by **S-Express**, whose 'Theme From S-Express' more than trebles its sales as it vaults from number 25 to number three.

The Pet Shop Boys also remain at the top of the CD singles chart, bringing to an end a remarkable run which has seen 15 different titles top the chart in as many weeks. The last CD single to spend more than seven days at the summit? The Pet Shop Boys' last single 'Always On My Mind' which ruled the roost for four whole weeks.

● The seventh son of a seventh son is, according to legend, a very special and gifted individual. No doubt **Glen Campbell**, who is one, would agree, and naming their album 'The Seventh Son Of A Seventh Son' has certainly done **Iron Maiden** no harm at all.

This week the album debuts at number one after selling 75,000 copies in its first seven days on release. It's Maiden's second number one album, their first being 1982's 'The Number Of The Beast'.

Maiden are an established act, with seven chart albums to their credit since 1980, but it's good to see that six of the seven best selling albums of the year to date are by acts making their recording debut. The other is a compilation of hits, making the eighth placed 'Best Of OMD' the highest ranked album by an established act.

Here's the top 10 of the year so far, with estimated sales in brackets (1988 only, remember, not cumulative): 1 INTRODUCING THE HARDLINE ACCORDING TO... — **Terence Trent D'Arby** (820,000), 2 NOW THAT'S WHAT I CALL MUSIC II — **Various** (610,000), 3 POPPED IN, SOULED OUT — **Wet Wet Wet** (540,000), 4 TURN BACK THE CLOCK — **Johnny Hates Jazz** (420,000), 5 THE CHRISTIANS — **the Christians** (340,000), 6 BRIDGE OF SPIES — **T'Pau** (325,000), 7 WHENEVER YOU NEED SOMEBODY — **Rick Astley** (320,000), 8 THE BEST OF OMD — **OMD** (320,000), 9 TANGO IN THE NIGHT — **Fleetwood Mac** (280,000), 10 BAD — **Michael Jackson** (270,000).

It's worth noting that, including its 1987 sales, the **Christians'** self-titled album has sold over 600,000

copies, an excellent performance for a first album, especially one that has not so far spawned a top 10 single.

This week, 'The Christians', which has claimed a place in the top 50 every week since it was released six months ago, surges 21 places to number 15, as their latest single 'Born Again' debuts at number 66.

It's the fifth hit off the album, following 'Forgotten Town', which reached number 22, 'Hooverville (And They Promised Us The World)' (number 21) 'When The Fingers Point' (number 34) and 'Ideal World' (number 14).

Few established acts can take five hits off an album, and for new acts to do so is quite exceptional.

Christians, we salute you!

Whitney Houston makes history this week by topping the American singles chart for the seventh time in a row, beating the old record of six consecutive number ones, established by the **Beatles** in 1966 and equalled by the **Bee Gees** in 1979.

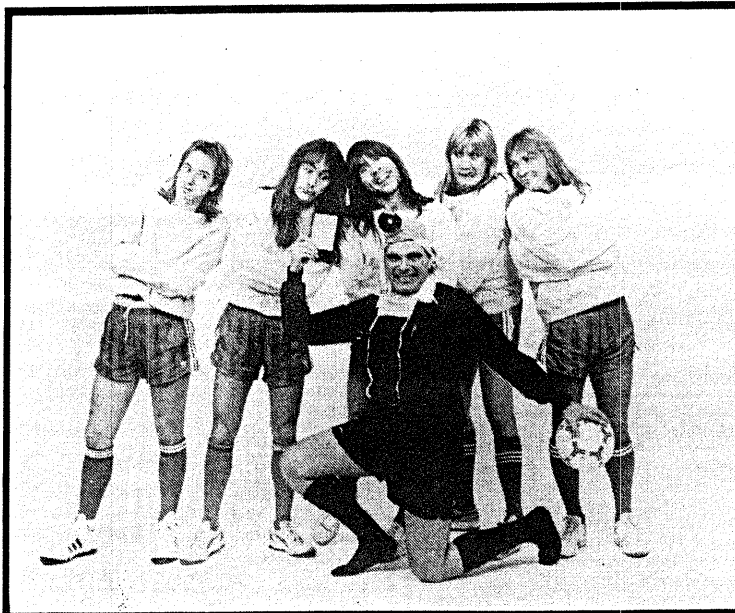
Whitney's latest success, 'Where

Do Broken Hearts Go' follows (in reverse chronological order) 'So Emotional', 'Didn't We Almost Have It All', 'I Wanna Dance With Somebody (Who Loves Me)', 'Greatest Love Of All', 'How Will I Know' and 'Saving All My Love For You'. Only 'I Wanna Dance With Somebody' and 'Saving All My Love For You' achieved similar success in Britain.

Whitney's last four number one are all from her 'Whitney' album, which, therefore, equals the record number of chart toppers taken from an album, a record established four weeks ago when 'The Man In The Mirror' became the fourth hit **Michael Jackson's** 'Bad' to replace position.

'Whitney' has remained in the 30 of the US album chart continuously for 44 weeks, during which time it has sold 5,613,291 copies. Her first album 'Whitney Houston' has sold more than eight million copies.

Whitney has also maintained an unbroken presence in the singles chart since 'I Wanna Dance With Somebody' debuted on 16 May 1987.
