THIS WEEK'S CHART

Youth has its fling on both sides of the Atlantic this week, with **Bros**, average age 19, knocking the **Time Lords** off the top of the UK singles chart with 'I Owe You Nothing', whilst 17-year-old **Debbie Gibson** triumphs single-handedly in America with 'Foolish Beat'.

Debbie is only the third female solo star in US chart history to take four top five hits off her debut album, 'Foolish Beat' being preceded by 'Out Of The Blue' which reached number three in April, 'Shake Your Love', number four last December, and 'Only In My Dreams', which also got to number four last September. This time, Debbie's album, also entitled 'Out Of The Blue', has sold 2,761,342 — or thereabouts — in America.

Debbie wrote all four of her hits, and is the most juvenile female singer ever to pen a number one. The youngest male is **Paul Anka**, who topped the chart in 1957 with his own composition 'Diana' a few weeks after his 16th birthday.

For their part, Bros are the youngest group to have a number one hit in Britain since **New Edition** reached the summit in 1983 with 'Candy Girl'. Bros have another reason to celebrate this week — they make their US chart debut, albeit rather quietly at number 96, with 'When Will I Be Famous'.

Elsewhere, the big story is that of the effect of the Nelson Mandela concert on the album chart. The 10 hour event, staged at Wembley Stadium, and screened in its entirety on BBC2, had an impact similar to the 1985 Live Aid and the BPI awards, increasing sales of albums significantly.

Main beneficiary was black American folk singer **Tracy Chapman**, who became a star

overnight. Her self-titled debut album was already doing very well, but after a rapturously acclaimed five minute appearance, during which she performed two songs off her album, it soared from number 25 to number 2.

Bad press and mediocre performance notwithstanding, **Whitney Houston** also reaped the rewards of her appearance with her latest album 'Whitney' climbing from number 13 to number 4, whilst the earlier 'Whitney Houston' re-entered the charts at number 72.

Eurythmics, **UB40**, **Simple Minds** and **Eric Clapton** all made dramatic gains, particularly Clapton whose double retrospective 'The Cream Of...' rebounded from number 87 to number 36. It's worth remembering that, though he guested on guitar for much of **Dire Straits'** set, Clapton only stepped up to the microphone once, to perform a marvellously laidback rendition of 'Wonderful Tonight'.

Dire Straits themselves performed with all the polish and unassuming assurance one might have expected, earning an unequivocal thumbs up from viewers which sent 'Brothers In Arms' soaring from number 59 to number 13. It last appeared in the top 20 in April 1987. With 162 consecutive chart appearances to its credit, dating back to its debut in May 1985, 'Brothers In Arms' recently dipped as low as number 89, and appeared to be in danger of losing its chart position altogether. Now it seems likely to remain a chart fixture for some time to come.

Though the majority of their set was drawn from 'Brothers In Arms', all Dire Straits' five earlier albums registered sales increases, with 'Alchemy', 'Making Movies', 'Love Over Gold', 'Dire Straits',

'Communique' returning to claim a place in the chart.

Some singles, for example 'The Twist (Yo, Twist)' by **the Fat Boys & Chubby Checker**, also made heavy gains, though it's much harder to assess to what extent these were due to the Mandela event, as the singles chart is so volatile anyway.

Whatever the reason, it's good to see **Salt 'n' Pepa's** 'Push It/Tramp' making a dramatic return to chart action at number 24. It originally peaked at number 41 in January. Then, its chart placing was based solely on sales of the ffr label release. Now it's a combination of this and a newly revived issue of the disc on Mel Medalie's Champion label.

Finally, let's not forget **George**

Michael, whose short three so came very deliberately comprised exclusively of Motown songs he not recorded. George did this to show his commitment was to the cause, and not to increasing his balance by promoting his album. Nevertheless, he acquitted himself so well that he managed to sway many who had previously resisted the temptation to buy his 'Faith' album, with the result that it climbed fourteen notches this week to number 23.

It was a thoughtful and touching gesture from the much-maligned Michael. It's a sobering thought whilst their performance at Wembley will make some of those who performed a good deal richer, Nelson Mandela remains a pris
