THIS WEEK'S CHARTS

ANALYSED BY ALAN JONES

● **U2** land their debut number one single with 'Desire' this week, more than five years after they first topped the album chart with 'Boy'.

Few acts have experienced a longer hiatus between their first number one album and their first number one single, the record of nine years being shared by **Pink Floyd** (number one album in 1970 with 'Atom Heart Mother', number one single in 1979 with 'Another Brick In The Wall Part 2') and **John Lennon**, who had a number one album in 1971 with 'Imagine', and finally the singles chart posthumously in 1980 with '(Just Like) Startin' Over'.

U2's record of having three number one albums before a number one single is also unusual, though **Led Zeppelin** had eight number one albums without even releasing a single, and **Bob Dylan**, despite topping the album charts no fewer than six times, has never reached higher than number four in the singles chart.

Finally, U2 are only the second Irish act to top both the singles and albums chart, emulating Waterford wonder **Gilbert O'Sullivan**, who completed the double in 1973.

● **Whitney Houston** goes for gold with her Olympics theme 'One Moment In Time', which sprints from number eight to bronze medal position this week, becoming her biggest hit since 'I Wanna Dance With Somebody (Who Loves Me)' reached number one 16 months ago.

'One Moment In Time', which, I have to say, sounds to me like a cliched also-ran from a domestic heat of Eurovision, has a surprisingly good pedigree, being the work of two highly successful veteran songwriters — namely **Albert Hammond** ('The Air That I Breathe', 'Don't Turn Around', 'Nothing's Gonna Stop Us Now', etc) and **John Bettis**.

A schoolchum of **Richard Carpenter**, Bettis broke his chart duck way back in 1972 collaborating with Richard on the

Carpenters' top 10 smash 'Goodbye To Love', but Hammond has been writing hits even longer, first hitting paydirt in 1968 with the facile 'Little Arrows', a hit for **Leapy Lee**.

● The 1988 remix of 'Fake' by **Alexander O'Neal** improves eight notches to number 16 this week. The original version of the track, released 16 months ago, peaked at number 33, but four other singles lifted from O'Neal's 'Hearsay' album have reached the top 30: 'Criticize' got to number four, 'Never Knew Love Like This' (a duet with **Cherrelle**) reached number 26, 'The Lovers' peaked at number 28, and '(What Can I Say) To Make You Love Me' crested at number 27.

● **Level 42** are still looking for their first number one album. Their latest offering, 'Staring At The Sun', debuted at number two last week, but can't find a way past **Bon Jovi's** 'New Jersey' despite selling upwards of 100,000 copies already.

Level 42's last album, 'Running In The Family', surrendered four hit singles and sold over half a million copies in Britain, and more than 2½ million worldwide.

One reason why 'Staring At The Sun' has failed to reach number one is that the first single from the album, 'Heaven In My Hands', was a very short-lived hit which peaked disappointingly at number 12.

Bassist extraordinaire and vocalist **Mark King**, who plays a pivotal role in the group, agrees to being disappointed with the performance of 'Heaven In My Hands', but observes: "'Staring At The Sun' is our most well-rounded and satisfying album yet, and I'm confident it will be more successful than 'Running In The Family'."

To ensure that it is, Level 42 are about to undertake the latest in a seemingly never-ending series of world tours, and are currently being followed day and night by a film crew whose task is to make the definitive warts-and-all documentary of the

definitive warts-and-all documentary of the group for future TV screening.

● The brouhaha over his proposed Docklands concert may not have done **Jean Michael Jarre's** blood pressure any good, but the attendant publicity has certainly given his new album, 'Revolutions', a fillip.

It races to number three this week to become Jarre's highest charted album since his first success, 'Oxygene', reached number two in 1977, and is sure to benefit further after his delayed concert — now concerts — takes place this weekend.

There styles are very different, but Jarre and fellow French keyboards player **Richard Clayderman** are involved in an interesting struggle for supremacy.

'Revolutions' is Jarre's ninth album chart

entry, putting him two clear of Clayderman as the most successful to act in the chart's 30 year history. To only their success in the Eighties, the men are tied on seven chart albums apiece. And, ignoring nationalistic considerations, the two men are the successful solo instrumental virtuosi of the Eighties, followed, but not very closely, by Greece's **Vangelis**, who will make fourth visit of the decade to the album chart next week with 'Direct', which technically, is not an instrumental at all containing some operatic warbling and reprocessed voices, though it consists largely of extended vocal free interludes.

Jarre's 'Revolutions' also includes a choir from Mali and others in audible contributions, but remains in the most pedantic of minds an instrumental album.
