THIS WEEK'S CHARTS

ANALYSED BY ALAN JONES

In February, **Kylie Minogue's** 'I Should Be So Lucky' jumped to the top of the singles chart, dethroning **Tiffany's** 'I Think We're Alone Now', which, in turn, had replaced **Belinda Carlisle's** 'Heaven Is A Place On Earth'. It was the first time in over 35 years of chart history that female soloists had achieved three consecutive number ones. This week, history repeats itself, as **Robin Beck's** 'First Time' moves decisively into pole position, in succession to **Enya's** 'Orinoco Flow' and **Whitney Houston's** 'One Moment In Time'.

Enya, in fact, loses her grip on the chart summit in fairly dramatic fashion, dipping to number five, but the cunning linguist's album 'Watermark' — it contains songs delivered in Latin, English and Gaelic — holds up much better, dropping to number nine a fortnight after peaking at number five. Thus far 'Watermark' has sold 150,000 copies. That's a vast improvement on Enya's last album, which was released by BBC Records nearly two years ago. Including her much praised theme to the BBC-TV series 'The Celts', the self-titled collection peaked at number 71 and sold around 25,000 copies.

In spite of Enya's collapse, the singles top three remains an all-female affair for the second week in a row, and the third time in chart history, with **Yazz's** 'Stand Up For Your Love Rights' climbing to number two, swapping places with Kylie Minogue's 'Je Ne Sais Pas Pourquoi', which sinks to number three. As mentioned above, Kylie's debut single, 'I Should Be So Lucky' got to number one in February. Since then, each of her three hits has peaked at number two — 'Je Ne Sais Pas Pourquoi' being preceded as a chart runner-up by 'Got To Be Certain' and 'The Loco-Motion'. The only other acts in chart history to suffer the frustration of three consecutive number twos are **Tom Jones's** 'The Sweet and Darts'.

But Kylie is handsomely rewarded for her disappointment as 'Kylie — The Album' moves back to the top of this week's album chart and, more impressively, simultaneously powers ahead of **Wet**

Wet Wet's 'Popped In, Souled Out' and **Terence Trent D'Arby's** 'Introducing The Hardline According To ...' to become the best-selling album of the year-to-date with, (so far) over 850,000 copies sold. D'Arby still holds a slender lead over the Wets in the battle for second place, but the Wets should move firmly ahead by the end of the week. **Fleetwood Mac's** 'Tango In The Night' also continues to sell well, with 800,000 copies sold this year, to add to the 850,000 it shifted in 1987. The album many, myself included, expected to emerge as the 1988 champion, **U2's** 'Rattle And Hum' is selling more slowly than anticipated, and is still short of 600,000 sales. Even the forthcoming release of 'Angles Of Harlem' as a single won't stimulate sales of 'Rattle And Hum' enough to make it a serious challenger for Kylie's crown. The young Aussie should see her album score the twin triumph of selling over a million copies and having the title of best-seller of the year — the fact that its hit selections have been ruthlessly over-exploited for compilations notwithstanding. The most obvious example of this is 'I Should Be So Lucky', which appears on four other albums in this week's chart, apart from Kylie's own: The current number 10 album 'Smash Hits Party', 'Hit Factory Volume 2' (number 16), 'Greatest Hits Of 1988' (number 17) and 'Ones On 1' (number 93). Meanwhile, **Angry Anderson's** 'Suddenly', used in Kylie's 'Neighbours' wedding scenes with fellow chart star and real life boyfriend **Jason Donovan**, debuts at number 51 on the singles chart. Angry's biggest (and only) hit with **Rose Tattoo**, 'Rock 'N' Roll Outlaw', reached number 60 in 1981. Australia's bicentennial year looks like ending as it started — with the chart under assault from its musical talent, the hits by Kylie, Jason and Angry being complemented by the fact that the hottest single in the entire chart is Aussie band **INXS's** 'Need You Tonight', which soars from number 18 to number four and must now be fancied to repeat its US number one success.

MP BANS ACID TRACK

He's approached Home Secretary, Douglas Hurd, to see if the record can be banned and we understand that he's also trying to get a court order to stop the record being sold.

Children Of The Night vocalist, Dan Boylan, was one of people arrested last week at a warehouse party in Essex. Boylan was kept in cells for 14 hours before being released without charges.
