THIS WEEK'S CHARTS

ANALYSED BY ALAN JONES

By one of those occasional quirks that make chart-watching so interesting, Sonja managed to hang onto top billing on the singles chart, despite being heavily outsold by **Bros** on the first four days of the week, and **Jive Bunny And The Mastermixers** on Friday and Saturday.

The Bros single 'Too Much', their first as a duo, sold incredibly well last Monday, and looked odds-on favourite to enter the chart at number one, but by Thursday it was clear that 'Too Much' would not become the first regular (i.e.: non-charity) record to debut at number one since **Frankie Goes to Hollywood's 'Two Tribes'** in 1984.

Jive Bunny And The Mastermixers, meanwhile, accelerated throughout the week; 'Swing The Mood' was put together by deejays **Andy Pickles** and **Les Hemstock** in Rotherham. It samples fifties and Sixties hits by **Chubby Checker**, **Bill Haley**, **Little Richard**, the **Everly Brothers**, **Elvis Presley** and **Danny and the Juniors**, amongst others, as well as large hunks of the 18 piece Ulster-based **John Anderson Big Band** **Glen Miller Medley**, a minor chart hit from Xmas 1985. 'Swing The Mood' debuted at number 54 a fortnight ago, soared to number 31 last week, and now stands at number three.

Next week should see an interesting battle for chart supremacy with **Sonia** and **Kylie Minogue**, whose new single 'Wouldn't Change A Thing' came out on Monday, battling to keep the **Stock Aitken Waterman** standard flying, whilst Jive Bunny and **Lil Louis** will be trying to wrest control.

The Lil Louis single, 'French Kiss', made a sensational debut at number 10. That's the highest debut by a previously

uncharted act (again excluding charity aggregations comprising old stagers) since **Bomb The Bass' 'Beat Dis'** entered at number five in February 1988.

Lil Louis' success is all the more impressive as the single is currently available only on 12 inch. It's already the third biggest hit to feature a simulated orgasm, being bettered only by **Jane Birkin** and **Serg Gainsbourg's 'Je T'Aime ... Moi Non Plus'**, a number one hit from 1969, and **Donna Summer's** number four hit from 1976 'Love To Love You Baby'. These two records both ran into censorship problems with Radio 1, which refused to play 'Je T'Aime' at all, and imposed a 9pm watershed on Donna's hit, though not until Paul Gambaccini had played it in full several times at an earlier hour on his late lamented US chart show. Auntie has clearly grown-up, because with only the full 10 minutes and two seconds version of the Lil Louis hit available for use. Radio 1 had to create its own 3½ minute edit of the track. This they did, daringly leaving in the breathy contributions of Lil Louis' (very close?) friend.

● **Earth Kitt** and **Bronski Beat's 'Cha Cha Heels'** continues its slow and stealthy ascent of the chart, climbing a further seven notches to number 32 this week. That makes it Eartha's biggest hit since 'Under The Bridges Of Paris' got to number seven over 34 years ago.

Gallup chart researcher **Bob Macdonald**, always chirpy near a full moon, notes that Eartha is the third chartmaker to address her footwear. Eartha purrs: 'Are you ready, heels? Start stomping', echoing **Nancy Sinatra's** 'Are you ready, boots? Start walking' on her 1966 chart topper 'These Boots Are Made for Walking'. Less assertive, as befits

his nature, was **Neil**, whose dreary greeting 'Hello, shoes' graced his 1984 remake of **Traffic's** hit 'Hole In My Shoe'.

CHARTFILE USA EXTRA

Of nine new entries to **Billboard's** Hot 100 singles chart this week, the highest, at number 73, is 'One' by those veteran campaigners, the **Bee Gees**. It's the Gibb brothers' first US hit since 1987, when their international chart-topper 'You Win Again' disappointingly went into decline after reaching only number 75. The failure of that record in America upset the trio enormously, and in recent interviews they have made a point of emphasising that their album, also entitled 'One', was aimed not at America, but at Britain and Europe.

It's ironic, therefore, that in America 'One' is already only two notches shy of the number 71 peak it reached here.

The last time a Bee Gees single was the highest new entry in America was on 23 21 May 1983, when 'The Woman In You' debuted at number 49. It went on to reach number 24, becoming their last top 40 hit.

● After 10 records took turns at number one in as many weeks, **Martika's 'Toy Soldiers'** breaks the sequence by holding on for a second week. Only once before in US chart history has the chart championship changed hands more weeks in a row, that being in 1975, when a different record was at the summit for 14 weeks in succession.

In addition to being number one in America, 'Toy Soldiers' finally makes the UK top 75 this week, debuting at number 51.



MIRROR MIRROR ON THE WALL, WHO'S THE FAIREST OF THEM ALL?

CBS released Bros' new single in three different 7-inch sleeves last week. One featured **Matt & Luke** together, the others showed them individually. In this private version of Opportunity Knocks singer Matt proved far more popular than Luke.

The brutal fact is that for every 100 singles bought by Brosettes bearing Matt's mug, record shops managed to sell on 77 decorated with Luke's likeness, and with both of the Bros bro'.
