Madonna's 'Vogue' continues at number one for a fourth week, equalling the record set by the first of her seven number ones, 1985's 'Into The Groove'. But her grip on the summit is loosening, with **Paula Abdul** and the **Wild Pair's** 'Opposites Attract' increasing its sales considerably. Last week, 'Opposites Attract' sold only 7,000 copies fewer than 'Vogue'. The week before it was outlived by a margin of 24,000.

However, it's quite possible that *neither* record will be number one next week, with possible contenders including **Record Mirror** cover star **Adamski** (up from number seven to number four this week), **The Adventures Of Stevie V** (from number 11 to number five), **Soul II Soul**, who debut at number eight with 'A Dreams A Dream' and even **Kylie Minogue**, whose latest single, 'Better The Devil You Know', was released on Monday.

● 'The Power' by **Snap** became the first single in chart history to record consecutive positions of one, two, three and four, but spoil its chances of extending the run this week by dipping to number seven.

● **The Cramps'** last single 'Bikini Girls With Machine Guns', surprised many by reaching number 35. Their latest single, 'All Men Are Bad', is not likely to do so well. It debuts at number 76 this week. Incidentally, The Cramps' title makes an interesting companion to the **Nick Lowe** single 'All Men Are Liars'.

● As readers Dean Forest (!) and Danny Morris observe, **Michael Bolton** is a very inquisitive chappie. His first hit posed the question 'How Am I Supposed To Live Without You'. His new one — up to number 38 this week — asks 'How Can We Be Lovers'.

Bolton dispenses with question marks on both titles. **Soul II Soul's** latest hit is also grammatically incorrect, the apostrophe being absent from 'A Dreams A Dream' on both the disc itself and its sleeve.

● **Natalie Cole's** 'Wild Women Do' soars from number 30 to number 16. It's the second hit off the film soundtrack album 'Pretty Woman', easily beating the peak of the first, **David Bowie's** 'Fame '90'.

● It's up to number two in their native Ireland, but **Something Happens!** single 'Hello, Hello, Hello (Petro)' is moving at a snail's pace here, where it's number 82 after four weeks in the shops.

● **Black Box** become the first Italian group ever to have a Top 20 album this week as 'Dreamland' debuts at number 14. Fellow countrymen the **The 49ers** reached number 49 (naturally) with their debut album in March.

● 'Save Me' is the first title to become a hit in the Sixties, Seventies, Eighties and Nineties, courtesy of **Fleetwood Mac**, whose single of that title debuts at number 72 this week.

Other songs of this name were hits for **Dave Dee, Dozy, Beaky, Mick & Tich** (1966), **Silver Convention**

(1975) and **Queen** (1980). Coincidentally, the new single by **Big Country**, which was released on Monday, and is also likely to chart, is also entitled 'Save Me'.

The **Fleetwood Mac** single is the first hit off their number one album 'Behind The Mask'. It's very unusual for an album to reach number one before a single has been lifted from it. Equally, few albums, except for compilations, yield as many as four Top 20 hits before they are released, but that is the case with **Sonia's** debut album 'Everybody Knows', which enters the chart at number seven this week.

It features **Sonia's** chart-topping debut single 'You'll Never Stop Me Loving You', her number 17 hit 'Can't Forget You', the number 10 smash 'Listen To Your Heart' and her current single 'Counting Every Minute', which dips a notch from its peak of number 16 to number 17 this week.

Sonia is the first Liverpool lass to have a top 10 album since 1968, when that other red-haired scouser, **Cilla Black**, scored

with 'Sher-oo'. Incidentally, two of **Sonia's** four hits include variants of their titles in their lyrics but never the titles themselves. On her current hit she sings "Counting every minute", and on 'You'll never stop Me Loving You' she croons "You'll never stop me from loving you".

CHARTFILE USA EXTRA
Female trio **Wilson Phillips** climb to number 12 this week with their debut 'Hold On'. It's the ELEVENTH (!) different single of that title to become a hit stateside in the past 22 years — and the biggest, eclipsing the number 15 peak scaled by a **Santana** single of the same name in 1982... **Kaoma's** hit 'Lamb' failed to reach the dizzy heights it achieved elsewhere in the USA, but its peak position of number 46 is the best for a Portuguese language disc, narrowly topping the number 47 peak of **Serg Mendes'** 1968 hit 'Mas Que Nada'.

SHAUN RYDER SOLO SINGLE

Shaun Ryder, lead singer with Happy Mondays, has announced plans to record solo single. Talking to Radio 1's Mark Goodier last week, Ryder stated that the song will be a cover of Donovan's 'Colours'.
"I'm a big fan of Dons, he's a good fella. I'm going to get Johnny Marr to guitar and Barney [Sumner from New Order] to do backing vocals.
"It'll be a good record to do for the summer."
A release date has yet to be announced.

NEW KIDS HYSTERIA

Thirteen New Kids On The Block fans needed hospital treatment on Sunday after collapsing while watching the group at Brighton Centre. Another 50 fans were treated at the concert before being allowed home.
