early 1970s years elapsed between **ton John's** singles chart debut and his first Number One solo hit, but having finally reached pole position he seems very reluctant to surrender his advantage. 'Sacrifice/Healing Hands' continues at Number One for the fifth straight week, to become Britain's longest-reigning chart number since **Black Box's** 'Ride On Me', a six week champion last September/October.

'Sacrifice/Healing Hands' has rapidly ended the year-to-date sales rankings and now stands at number two behind **Sinéad O'Connor's** 'Nothing Compares 2 U', having sold more than 0,000 copies. 'Sacrifice/Healing Hands' has seen off the challenge of **Pavarotti's** 'Nessun Dorma' and isn't seriously threatened by **Craig McLachlan's** 'Mona', even though the latter disc moves up to number two this week, but it's still odds-on that there will be a new Number One next week, and all the smart money is on 'Turtle Power'.

The debut single by **Partners In Ryme**, which reached number 13 in America last month, storms on to the chart at number four this week. It thus comes the highest debuting disc ever by an act new to the chart, beating the number five debuts of the former record label **Neil** ('Hole In My Shoe' in 1984) and **Bomb The Bass** ('Beat Dis' in 1988).

'Turtle Power' is taken from the teenage mutant Ninja Turtles' movie, a mega-grossing hit Stateside due to make cinema debut here in November. It's the second single from the soundtrack album, and has already very convincingly passed the first. **Hi Tek 3's** 'Spin That Wheel', which peaked at number 69 in

February, despite the involvement of no lesser luminary than **Ya Kid K**.

● More than a quarter of this week's Top 40 is made up of remakes, amongst them two songs recorded as album tracks by **The Rolling Stones** more than a quarter of a century ago — 'Mona', now a hit for Craig McLachlan and 'I'm Free' currently cutting it for the **Soup Dragons**.

'Mona' was written by **Bo Diddley** (under his real name of **Ellas McDaniels**) in 1964, and was covered by the Stones on their album 'Rolling Stones No 2.' in 1965. Later that same year, the **Jagger/Richard** original 'I'm Free' turned up on their album 'Out Of Our Heads'. The Stones are of course still in the Top 40 themselves with 'Almost Hear You Sigh', which is only slowly sinking from the number 31 peak that made it the biggest of the three hits pulled off their album 'Steel Wheels'. Another remake of a Stones track likely to make an impact on the chart is the **Steppford Wives'** dance remake of '2000 Light Years From Home', a brilliant Jagger/Richard composition that was first heard on their 1967 album 'Their Satanic Majesties Request'.

With so many remakes around, it's not surprising that individual artists' catalogues are being raided time and again by would-be hitmakers. Running neck-and-neck with the Stones in this respect is the unlikely figure of **Roberta Flack**. **Paul Johnson** recently came close to having a hit with his update of her hit 'Don't Make Me Wait Too Long', and **Joanna Law** is currently scoring with 'First Time Ever I Saw Your Face', while **Jillian Mendez** has updated 'Feel Like Making Love' and **Nuf-EI-TEE** have tackled 'Back

Together Again', Roberta's smash hit duet with **Donny Hathaway**.

Donny's daughter, **Lalah Hathaway**, launched her career this week with — you've guessed it — a remake. Her first single is 'Heaven Knows', a new version of a fairly unsuccessful 1985 single by **Jaki Graham**. Other old songs shaping up to become hits in new versions include 'Silly Games', a number two hit from 1979 now overhauled by **Beats International's** vocalist **Lindy Layton** with vocal backing supplied by the original hitmaker **Janet Kay**. Two versions of **IOCC's** Number One hit 'I'm Not In Love', one in English by **IJ & The SI Soundwave** and one in Spanish by **Roé**; Mike Oldfield's 'Tubular Bells', chiming out anew in a Plutonic version; **Diana Ross and The Supremes'** 'Reflections' now by **Jam Society**; Swedish duo **Da Yeene's** motoring revamp of **The Beatles'** 'Drive My Car'; **The Senators'** frankly disappointing stab stab at **Van Morrison's** 'Brown Eyed Girl'; **Ben Liebrand's** rap re-write of **Stevie**

**Wonder's** 'I Wish' and, just to make things complicated, 'Feel Like Making Love' by **Deborah Conway**. No relation to the aforementioned Roberta Flack/Jillian Mendez record, this is in fact a soulful update of **Bad Company's** hit of the same name. And this is only the tip of a very large iceberg.

● **Paula Abdul's** 'Knocked Out' belatedly becomes the fourth Top 40 hit off her debut album 'Forever Your Girl'. Paula's first-ever single as long ago as September 1988, it failed to chart then, but reached number 45 when re-issued last August. Now remixed by **Shep Pettibone**, it returns to chart at number 28 this week. Paula also reached number three with 'Straight Up', number 24 with 'Forever Your Girl' and, most recently, number two with 'Opposites Attract' in May. A fifth single from her album ('It's Just') entitled 'It's Just The Way That You Love Me' peaked at number 74, while a sixth 'Cold Hearted' failed to chart at all.
