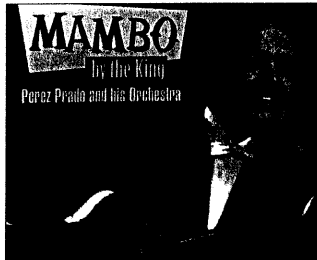

CHART COMMENTARY

Mambo King Perez Prado was born in Cuba in 1916 and died in Mexico in 1989. He was one of the most influential artists in the history of Latin American music and had a UK number one with **Cherry Pink & Apple Blossom White** in 1955. He posthumously registered a number two hit in 1996 with **Guaglione**, which gained fame after being used in a Guinness commercial. He was also the first artist to record both **Mambo No. 5**

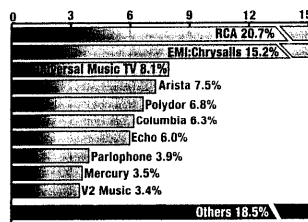
and **Quien Sera (Sway)** – covers of which occupy the top two slots in this week's chart. **Mambo No. 5** was one of the first two tracks he recorded for RCA after he signed for the label in 1951, while **Quien Sera (Sway)** was recorded in the late Fifties with vocalist **Rosemary Clooney**. The latter track, retitled **Mucho Mambo (Sway)** in its current incarnation, has been recorded by **Cliff Richard**, **Dean Martin** and even in Icelandic by **Bjork**.

Britain has its first mambo number one since 1955 this week, as **Lou Bega's** **Mambo No. 5 (A Little Bit Of...)** storms to the top, after selling more than 224,000 units. That is almost twice as many sales as **Shaft's** (**Mucho Mambo**) **Sway**, which enters at number two. With **Geri Halliwell's** **Mi Chico Latino** dipping 1-3, the entire top three are Latin-flavoured hits for the first time in chart history.

Bega's single is an adaptation of the original **Mambo No. 5**, a **Perez Prado** instrumental for which Bega and pal **Zippy** have penned lyrics, and it is the first mambo-styled chart-topper since **Rosemary Clooney's** **Mambo Italiano** topped in 1955. Clooney, ironically, was also the original vocalist on (**Mucho Mambo**) **Sway**, courtesy of a sample, but was replaced by a session vocalist after **BMG** refused a licence for the sample and denied the nation the opportunity of seeing the still giggling 71-year-old Clooney strutting her stuff on **Top**

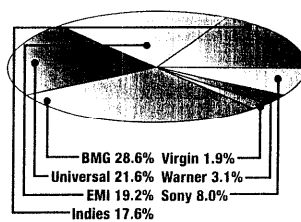

Of The Pops. Britain is the 12th country in which **Mambo No. 5** has reached number one, and it is also climbing the US Hot 100 at a

blistering pace, surging 63-35 this week. Simultaneous with the UK release of **Mambo No. 5** debuting at number one, the import,

which peaked at number 31 last week, disappears from the chart altogether. That is more a consequence of chart regulations than an indication it is not selling. UK rights owners can and invariably do opt to have import sales killed by CIN chart compilers **Millward Brown** as soon as a record is released here. As mentioned last week, the rising tide of European hits being sought by homecoming tourists and catered for at low dealer prices (typically £2.49, compared to domestic releases at £2.69/£2.76) has caused a major upturn in sales of imports, those appearing in this week's Top 200 including **Eiffel 65's** **Blue (Da Be Dee)** (number 51), **Ann Lee's** **2 Times** (number 77), **Enrique Iglesias's** **Bailamos** (number 92), **DJ Jean's** **Launch** (number 102) AND number 107) and **ATB's** **Don't Stop** (number 103), to name but a few. The **Eiffel 65** single is also number three in the budget album chart because the CD runs to more than the 20 minutes allowed for the singles chart.

CHART COMMENTARY

One of the most prolific artists of the last 20 years, Prince returns to the chart this week with his retrospective **The Vault...Old Friends 4 Sale** debuting at number 47. Released as part of his Warner Music severance deal, the album features previously unreleased material from 1985-1994, including many tracks which were previously much-sought by collectors, among them *She Spoke 2 Me*, *When The*

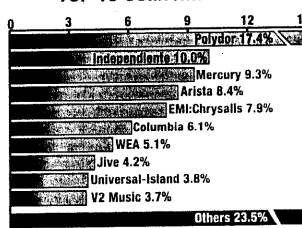
Lights Go Down, *Extraordinary and The Rest Of My Life*.

It is unlikely to become his eighth UK platinum album - it sold fewer than 3,000 copies last week - but it does restore him to the chart for the first time since 1996, and suggests there are enough fans still around to ensure that his forthcoming Arista album will become his 11th chart success of the Nineties.

Travis are still on a roll. Their album *The Man Who* makes its ninth consecutive week-on-week increase in sales, rising to a new high of more than 48,000 last week. It retains number one position with some ease, outselling **Boyzone's** *By Request* by more than 57%, and has now sold more than 270,000 units. Though it is unlikely to beat the overall sales of *By Request* - the number one album of the year, which will top a million sales later this week - if it carries on at its current pace, it could eventually pose a threat to the **Stereophonics'** *Performance & Cocktails*, which is the biggest selling album of new material issued thus far in 1999. The **Stereophonics'** album, released exactly six months ago, has sold more than 580,000 units to date, and is itself enjoying a bit of a revival, jumping 11-6 this week as its fourth hit, *I Wouldn't Believe Your Radio*, enters the singles chart.

Des O'Connor sells records. Not his own - though there was a time... - but as the

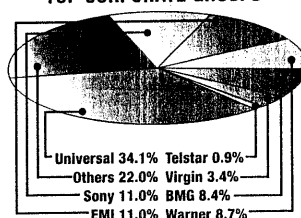

genial host of a primetime TV show, O'Connor draws huge ratings and has spurred some major sales action. He did so

again last week, when one of his guests was Italian tenor **Andrea Bocelli**, who reaps considerable rewards for his endeavours, as

his latest album *Sogno* explodes to number four, after re-entering the album chart last week at number 17. Released in April, the album originally peaked at number 21, and sold nearly 23,000 copies last week to boost its overall sales tally to more than 90,000.

Jethro Tull extend their album chart span beyond 30 years with the debut at number 44 of *J-Tull Dot Com*. It is the veteran folk/rock act's first appearance in the chart since 1996, when a remastered and expanded *Aqualung* reached number 53. It is their 26th hit album in all, and the first album to debut on the UK chart with a title that is also the name of an internet site - though that is actually *j-tull.com* if we are going to be technical.

A contemporary of **Jethro Tull's**, **Richard Thompson** also deserves a mention for his number 28 debut with *Mock Tudor*, a position he has bettered just once, with 1994's *Mirror Blue*, which reached number 23.

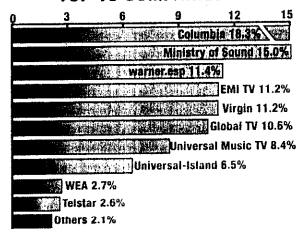
COMPILATIONS

The latest warner.esp/Global Television/Sony TV compilation **Big Hits 99** makes its expected debut atop the compilation chart, with sales of more than 97,000 last week proving almost exactly twice the number sold by nearest challenger, **Ibiza Annual 99**. **Big Hits 99's** arrival at number one was almost inevitable, as the compilation chart championship becomes a fairly predictable procession. Last year, **Now! 40** was knocked off the top by **The Ibiza Annual**, which was, in turn, topped by **Big Hits 98**. This year it has gone **Now! 43**, **Ibiza Annual 99** and **Big Hits 99**. Though the titles are the same, everyone is a bit earlier this year, as the triumvirate was not completed in 1998 until 19 September. I should, incidentally, offer my apologies

to the Ministry Of Sound label, as last week's commentary credited **Now! 43** as still being number one. It was when I wrote it, but not by the end of the week, and should have been altered accordingly. The success of **Ibiza Annual 99** underlines the remarkable impact that Ministry Of Sound is having on the compilation sector, and was its fifth number one album of the year - more than any major. Prior to **Ibiza Annual 99**, it topped the chart this year with **The Clubbers Guide To Ibiza - Summer 99**, **Trance Nation**, **Dance Nation 6 - Tall Paul & Brandon Block** and **Clubbers Guide To...99**.

Music To Watch Girls By continues to be the MOR compilation of the year. It drifts 5-7 this week but has sold more than 273,000 units, beaten only in this market by **Now! 42** and **Now! 43**.

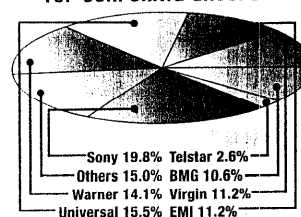
